### Spot the feature

When out for your walks observe the land around you and human or physical features that you see. Can you make a grid or tick list of which features you can find? Maybe you could write a description or set of clues about things in your area such as fields, forests, bridges, main roads, houses, rivers, ponds, picnic areas or shops?

### Country Fact-file

Look at a map of the world, globe or atlas and pick a place you would like to visit or find out more about. Use


