

## GALLEYWOOD INFANT SCHOOL

### 2014 – 2015 ‘Sports Premium’ - Report to the Governing Body

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for the next three academic years to improve the provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – and has been allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ring fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

The total funding for Galleywood Infant School for the academic year 2014- 2015 is **£8550**.

The development plan for the provision of School Sport at Galleywood Infant School is set out in the following table:

Five other sports clubs (soccer, gymnastics, karate, basketball and tennis) have taken place after school but these are not funded by the Sports Premium.

### Inter School Competition

On Tuesday 14 October 2014 6 Year 1 children and 6 Year 2 children took part in a cross country competition against another 20 schools at Chelmsford Sports and Athletic Centre. The Galleywood children ran very well and they all completed the course.

On Monday 20 October 2014 7 Year 2 children participated in a football workshop and competition at Great Baddow High School. They played five mini games and won all of them.

On Monday 13 April 2015 8 Year 2 children took part in a 3 Tees cricket tournament at Great Baddow High School.

On Monday 20 April 24 Y1 children participated in the Teddy 'Lympic Games and competed against six other schools at Chelmsford Sports and Athletics Centre.

On Thursday 23 April 2015 2 teams of Year 2 children played in a Tag Rugby competition against 6 other schools at Galleywood Infant School

On Tuesday 9 June 2015 all the Year 2 children took part in the Mini Games Competition at Chelmsford Sports and Athletics Centre.

### Impact

During the last academic year the Sports Premium funding has had a strong impact on PE and School Sport at Galleywood Infant School, most noticeably

- The introduction of new school sports into the curriculum, which in turn has raised the profile of PE.
- Children have widened their experience and enjoyed new sports and learnt different skills.
- Staff are more confident at teaching a range of sports, especially dance, gymnastics and cricket.
- There has been an increased participation in after-school sports clubs.
- Stronger links have developed with out of school sports clubs. Some children have joined the Kazenki Karate Club. Other children are keen to join the newly formed Chelmsford Elite basketball club and one child has joined the Chelmsford hockey club.
