Children will design and make their own honey recipes and recipe books to sell.


End Point:



Visit to Hyde Hall:

Children will identify a range of common plants. They will learn about the different parts of a plant and conditions required for growth. They will learn about how plants vary according to climate.

Year 2: Children will name and label parts of a plant and describe their functions. They will learn about pollination and the role insects play.

Year 1: Children will name a variety of plants and label their parts. They will begin to develop an understanding of pollination and the role insects play.

Scientific Enquiry:

Children will investigate conditions for successful plant growth.

Year 2: Children will make predictions before designing their own investigation.

Year 1: Children will test different conditions for plant growth in groups.

Art and DT: Children will be developing their skills in sculpture

Year 2: Children will continue to develop clay modelling techniques to include moulding, carving, rolling, pinching and cutting.

Year 1: Children will learn to develop clay modelling techniques including moulding and pinching.

Children will learn to use different clay tools for effect and to add details to their sculptures

Children will apply their clay modelling skills to create a clay sunflower.

DT: Children will be developing their skills in food

Children will revisit the safety and hygiene rules when cooking and using equipment.

Children will follow and evaluate recipes using honey as an ingredient.

Children will choose from a range of ingredients to design their own recipe using honey.



Year 2 Computing: Children will be developing knowledge and skills in creating media – digital photography

Children will learn the skills needed to take a successful photograph including close-ups, focusing, portrait and landscape.

Children will edit their photographs for effect, Children will display their chosen photograph in a photography competition of the natural world
