We are enjoying some brilliant learning this term as part of our Galleywood whole school theme:

"How do colours make our world the amazing place it is?"

Our curriculum this year was inspired by the book One World, Many Colours by Ben Lerwill.

Lots of parents accompanied us to the allotments, where we were very excited to spot pumpkins amongst a wide range of other fruit, vegetables and flowers.











The delicious cooking smells changed from day to day as children made and tasted pumpkin muffins and in Year 2 pumpkin pesto spread on bread. The children agreed it was delicious! Today I am sure I could smell pumpkin soup......?







Yr1 and Yr2 classes had a brilliant visit to Parklands Farm this week, starting in the grain barn and then seeing and making drawings of the huge tractors and the combine harvester used to cut the wheat and barley.









We then explored a field where borage had been harvested and looked at the tiny seedlings that had started to grow as soon as a little rain fell. Mrs Willett invited the children to see what insects and bugs they could find under stones and even in the soil. I am very grateful to Christy Willett and Jane Gowers, as well as Julie and Richard from the Chaplin Close Allotments for offering our children these memorable visits and experiences as part of their learning.

We are hoping to build our pictures outside so that the materials can be returned to decompose where they fell - this is important for the plants, minibeasts and birds that live around our school. Photographs of our creations will be displayed on the school website and shared via Tapestry.

The school council have met with me and will be talking with their classes about whether we would like a friendship bench in our playground, and if so what would it be like, and where should it be sited?

We talked about setting up a trail to encourage children to



be more active - what should we include? Where could the trail go and what signs will we need? The new School Council also have some ideas of their own which they would like to ask the teachers, the governors and Mrs Dennis about!

Essex Local Offer Roadshows


